



Marin Housing Authority and Burbank Housing Initiate Temporary Resident Relocation Process to Begin Golden Gate Village Revitalization

Marin City, Calif. — July 31, 2026 — Marin Housing Authority (MHA) and Burbank Housing today announced a major milestone in the long-awaited revitalization of Golden Gate Village. Residents in the first phase of revitalization are now receiving 30-day notices that begin the temporary relocation process for the first 88 homes scheduled for renovation.

This milestone reflects more than two years of collaboration with residents to shape the future of Golden Gate Village. Throughout the planning process, community feedback helped refine the project, historic preservation remained a priority, and the long-term affordability of Golden Gate Village was reaffirmed for current and future residents.

Residents in the first phase previously received 90-day notices informing them that temporary relocation would be required and reaffirming their guaranteed right to return to their revitalized homes. The 30-day notices provide the next formal step in the relocation process and include additional information to help residents prepare for their move.

To minimize disruption, most households will be temporarily relocated to homes within Golden Gate Village, allowing residents to remain in their community while revitalization is underway. Temporary relocations are expected to last approximately three to four months as work is completed on each home.

The revitalization team, including relocation specialists, is working one-on-one with every household to develop individualized relocation plans that address each family's unique needs before, during, and after their temporary move. Additional support will be provided to households with school age children, seniors and those with special needs. Prior to relocating, residents will sign a new lease that guarantees their right to return to their original revitalized home. All costs associated with the revitalization, temporary relocation and return move will be paid by the developer.

"This milestone reflects the commitments we have made to residents throughout this process," said Dr. Tonia Lediju, Executive Director of Marin Housing Authority. "We will continue working alongside every household to ensure their temporary relocation and return home are carefully planned and thoughtfully supported. Our commitment remains the same: to work with residents every step of the way as we deliver modern, safe, and affordable homes for the Golden Gate Village community." Marin Housing Authority and Burbank Housing remain committed to keeping residents informed, providing individualized support, and working in partnership with residents throughout every phase of the revitalization.
